# Equality at the Merz Akademie

As part of society, the Merz Akademie is also dominated by power constellations that create and reproduce underrepresentation, inequality and discrimination.

The Merz Akademie's equal opportunity officers strive to achieve equality for all socially disadvantaged and underrepresented groups.

At the same time promoting equality is a cross-sectional task of the university that affects every member of the university and for which everyone bears responsibility.

# Equality in state law and the Basic Law

The promotion of equality is anchored in law at all German universities: For the academic sector, i.e. students, professors, academic staff in § 4 of the Baden-Württemberg State University Act (LHG). Equal opportunities for non-scientific employees, i.e. employees in the scientific support sector, are codified in the Act on the Realization of Equal Opportunities for Women and Men in Public Service in Baden-Württemberg (Equal Opportunities Act - ChancenG). The Basic Law formulates the prohibition of unequal treatment on the basis of various criteria in Article 3 (3) of the Basic Law.

# Forms of discrimination (examples)

## Ableism

structural discrimination against people with physical and mental disabilities; often translated as "hostility toward the disabled."

## Ageism

structural discrimination against people because of their age (adultism among children and young people; ageism among the elderly).

#### Anti-Semitism (and Anti-Judaism)

structural discrimination, hostility and hatred against Jews (Anti-Judaism is religiously motivated).

### Anti-Romanism

structural discrimination against and hostility towards Roma/ Romnija and Sinti/ze.

## Sexism / Heterosexism /

Homo- and Transphobia structural discrimination against people on the basis of their gender and/or sexual preference.

#### Islamophobia

structural discrimination against people because of their Muslim faith.

#### Classism

structural discrimination with reference to socio-economic group membership.

#### Lookism

structural discrimination with reference to ascribed forms of body, appearance, clothing.

#### Racism

structural discrimination against people on the basis of skin color, culture, migration history, languages (classical racism, cultural racism).
